

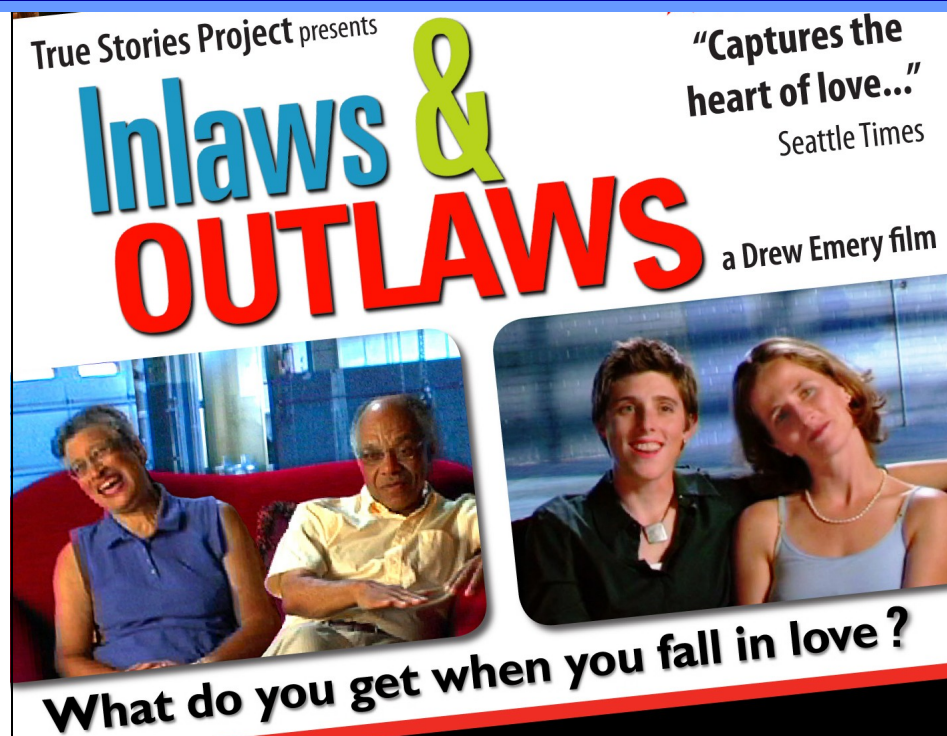
LGBT Week 2009
